## DSAT Tec Trimix Instructor Course

The DSAT Tec Trimix Instructor course trains candidates to conduct the Tec Deep Trimix course. The content includes philosophy, organization, practical considerations, promotion and other aspects that teaching the Tec Trimix Diver course requires.

You will learn how to teach candidates to conduct trimix dives to 75 meters.

The course consists of two parts. Part one focuses on developing and reviewing the knowledge and skills required for trimix diving to 75 meters. Part two focuses on honing candidate Trimix diving skills to role model teaching levels and on teaching sessions for knowledge development, practical applications and training dives.

The course is performance based but usually takes five days and includes independent learning, academic sessions, and open water dives.

To enroll on the Tec Trimix Instructor course a candidate must be a DSAT Tec Deep Instructor, be certified as a Tec Trimix diver or equivalent certification and have a minimum of 200 logged dives where at least 20 were technical decompression dives requiring at least one stage/decompression cylinder of these at least 10 must have been made deeper than 40 meters using trimix.

After completing the Tec Deep Instructor course candidates must meet the following additional requirements prior to becoming a Tec Trimix Instructor (if they have not already done so)

Have a minimum of 350 logged dives with at least 50 stage decompression dives that had a maximum depth over 40 meters. At least 10 of these deeper than 50 meters using trimix with less than 21 % oxygen.

The course costs £650 for UK dives or £550 for foreign dives. This includes the Tec Trimix Instructor Manual and instructor slates.

Not included is the Tec Trimix student manual (some candidates already have them), your application to DSAT (currently £29.30), any transport, accommodation, dive site entry fees, boat fees, gas fills or equipment hire.
